## a) PB18-09 Amended TRUSTEES OF PRINCETON UNIVERSITY

Amended General Development Plan

NW corner of Washington Road & US Route 1

Block 3, Lots 1.011 & 1.0113 Property Zoned: E District

MLUL: 11/6/24

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Amendment to a General Development Plan approved on January 29, 2020, and memorialized on April 29, 2020, File No. PB18-09 (Original Approval) submitted by the Trustees of Princeton University (Applicant). The Applicant is requesting this amendment to the original approval because the boundary of the Applicant-owned Education District-zoned properties has changed (Project). The Project is bounded on the west by the Delaware & Raritan Canal, on the south by Washington Road, on the east by US Route 1, and on the north by Lower Harrison Street.

Attorney Muller confirmed that the proof of publication and service are in order and the Board has jurisdiction.

Christopher H. DeGrezia with Faegre Drinker Biddle & Reath, Attorney for The Trustees of Princeton University, explained that any change or update to a general development plan, they must return to the Board for every element of the plan. He gave a background and stated that the application was originally approved in January 2020. He stated they will explain how the boundaries have been adjusted (they no longer own the corner piece) and how the calculations have been updated. On the opposite side, Eden Way was vacated by West Windsor Township and consolidated into their lot. Nothing else is being changed.

The following gave a presentation on behalf of the applicant. He was sworn-in by Attorney Muller.

### b) PB24-08 TRUSTEES OF PRINCETON UNIVERSITY—BASEBALL STADIUM

Preliminary/Final Major Site Plan Court Drive

Block 3, Lot1.0113

Property Zoned: E District

MLUL: 11/6/24

A preliminary and final major site plan application with associated design waivers to construct a +/- 7,801 square foot baseball ballpark and related improvements such as bullpens, a netted batting tunnel, fencing, a scoreboard, speakers and sound system, a solid-surface batter's eye, foul poles, and light poles (the Project). The Project site is located on the

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Princeton University Lake Campus Meadows Neighborhood, just to the south of Court Drive situated adjacent in the softball ballpark in West Windsor Township.

Attorney Muller confirmed that the proof of publication and service are in order and the Board has jurisdiction.

Christopher H. DeGrezia with Faegre Drinker Biddle & Reath, Attorney for The Trustees of Princeton University, gave a description of the project. The ballpark was originally approved with the general development plan in 2020.

Sylvia Ascarelli, 27 Melville Road: Ms. Ascarelli spoke about the pedestrian path and said it stops at Fisher Place. She asked if the applicant can contact NJDOT and West Windsor Township. A crossing at Fisher Place would be safer to go to the stadium.

Kristin Appelget, Assistant Vice-President, Office of Community and Regional Affairs, Princeton University: Ms. Appelget stated that the University agrees with the path connection and they anticipate NJDOT making the connection. Mayor Marathe added that the widening of Route 1 was approved at least 7 years ago.

Seeing no further comments, Mr. Pankove made a motion to close the meeting for public comment; seconded by Mr. Schectel. Passed by voice vote.

Mr. Pankove made a motion to approve application PB24-08 with conditions enumerated by the professionals; seconded by Ms. Bahree.
