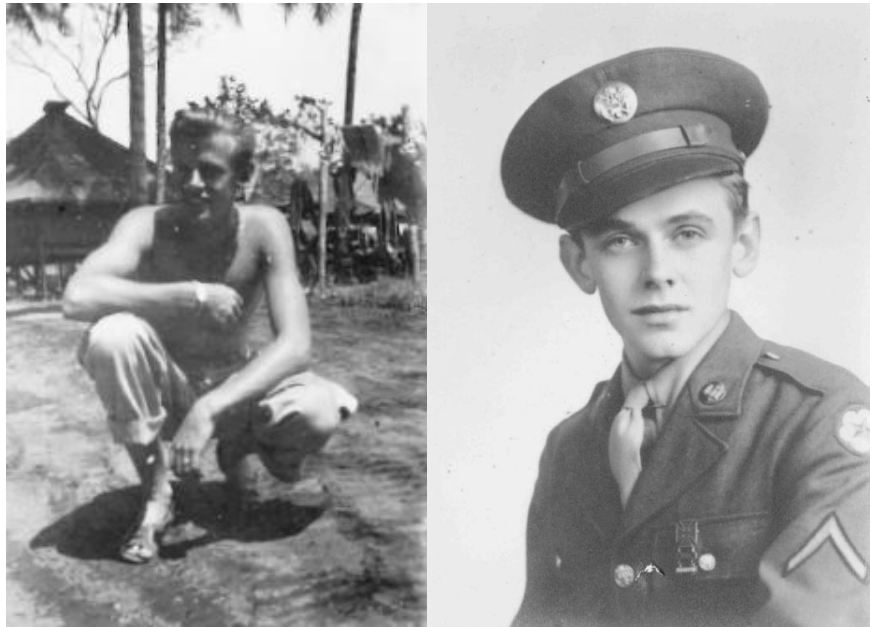
ARTHUR FRANK

Arthur Frank was born on September 18, 1924, the son of Michael and Wilhelmina Frank. He had one younger brother, William. He worked as a surveyor before being called for service on March 3, 1943. After basic training, he entered a 12 week Army electrician course. He was deployed to the Western Pacific Theater (Manila and New Guinea) as a Tec-5 Power Lineman with the 5206 Combat Engineers and was the chief electrician at the base in Manila.

He separated from the Army on January 11, 1946, with the following commendations:

- Asiatic Pacific Theater Ribbon
- Good Conduct Medal
- Victory Medal WWII
- Honorable Service Medal WWII

He was married on September 21, 1946 to Alice Morgan and they had two children. He was a talented carpenter/builder, considered one of the best finish carpenters in Bergen County. His favorite pastimes were reading and deep sea fishing.

He was a life member and a past Commander (1975-76) of the Walter Nightengale American Legion Post #57 in Waldwick, NJ. His father, Michael Frank, was a WWI veteran and, the chaplain and founding member of the post in 1927.

Arthur is buried at the Florida National Cemetery in Bushnell, FL. He was a loving husband, father and grandfather.

His daughter, Lynn, a West Windsor resident, is honored and extremely proud to place a star on the Centennial American Legion Monument in memory of her father.
